

Globethics.net Library Copyright Guidelines for Submissions

When you submit a document to Globethics.net Library (hereafter GE Library), you confirm that you are entitled to make it freely available to the GE Library users under the following conditions and/or situations:

1-You are the author and copyright holder of your work, then you may opt either for

1a-*"I am entitled to upload the document, because I am the author ..."* This will generate the statement *"All rights reserved"* (the classical copyright) OR a

1b-Creative Commons (CC) license (see below point 3 and 4)

2-If there are rights of third parties involved (f.ex. a publisher), you confirm that you have the permission to publish the document on GE Library by choosing option

2a-*"I am entitled to upload the document, because I ... have the permission of the copyright/license holder"*. This will generate the statement *"All rights reserved"* (classical copyright)

3-If there are NO rights of third parties involved, and you are willing to publish your work under an open license, such as a Creative Commons license, you choose the option

3b-*"There is no third party copyright/license. I publish my work under an open Creative Commons Attribution License (by default CC BY 4.0, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/>)"*

This means: the author grants the user the right to make free use of the content, including copying, sharing, and modifying it, provided that attribution is given to the (original) author and reference to the corresponding license.

The user is therefore free to use and re-use the content with no obligation nor restriction other than to give attribution to the (original) author.

In case you would need to change the default copyright/license statement, you may modify the "copyright/license" field of your submission record at your convenience after completion of your submission.

4-In future GE Library will put in place a **drop down menu**, allowing the user to choose among various CC licenses:

- CC BY 4.0 (Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 International, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/>). This is the standard option
- CC0 1.0 Universal (Public Domain Dedication, see <https://creativecommons.org/publicdomain/zero/1.0/>)
- CC BY-SA 4.0 (Creative Commons Attribution-ShareAlike 4.0 International, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-sa/4.0/>)

- CC BY-NC 4.0 (Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial 4.0 International, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc/4.0/>)
- CC BY-ND 4.0 (Creative Commons Attribution-NoDerivatives 4.0 International, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nd/4.0/>)
- CC BY-NC-ND 4.0 (Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivatives 4.0 International, see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/4.0/>)

Currently the default option is CC BY 4.0

5-Terms and conditions of CC licenses:

CC0: You dedicate the content to the public domain, while renouncing to claim any rights (*most appropriate for Open Educational Resources OER*)

CC BY: You claim authorship, i.e. attribution, while allowing free use and re-use of the content (*appropriate for Open Educational Resources OER*)

CC BY-SA: You claim authorship, i.e. attribution, while allowing free use and re-use of the content, under the condition that the user share his/her own alike (i.e. under the same license)

CC BY-NC: You claim authorship, i.e. attribution, while excluding commercial use

CC BY-ND: You claim authorship, i.e. attribution, while excluding any modification and/or re-mix of the content

CC BY-NC-ND: You claim authorship, i.e. attribution, while excluding commercial use and any modification and/or re-mix of the content (valid for example for GE publications)
