# Course Programme

## March to July 2022

Globethics.net Academy offers executive programme courses for professionals in different domains. The courses, mainly conducted as short term distant education courses with a duration between 8 and 13 weeks, aim to provide a unique international study environment for professional development and specialisation in applied ethics. The courses are offered online on the Academy's learning management system (Moodle) and are complemented with regular synchronous classes (live sessions) for engagement with fellow course participants and course instructors. The value-added of these courses is that regis-

tered participants have full access to the online platform, can study at their own pace and at their preferred time, while having complementary free access to the Globethics.net e-library collections and the full range of Globethics.net publication series. The course programme offers the opportunity to engage with participants and experts from around the world on topics of ethical relevance, with an emphasis on building competences through sharing of experiences and developing a values-driven and practice-oriented framework of understanding of the subject matters studied.

**Entry requirements:** English language proficiency at least at an intermediary-advanced level; two to three years of higher education studies, usually at Bachelor degree's level, and/or an equivalent professional experience.

Corporate social responsibility (CSR) has become one of the key components of corporate governance in the 21st century. Corporate societies and businesses understand their role in contributing to the development of societal well-being and cohabitation. Their commitment is often values-driven and bears in mind the social and environmental accountability of companies vis-à-vis multiple stakeholders.

This online course addresses salient questions regarding the understanding of CSR in the contemporary world. It assists participants with terminological clarifications and with regard to relating different models of corporate social responsibility to the international debate. More recently the understanding of CSR in relation to the attainment of the UN sustainable development goals has received new attention. It is with particular attention to concepts such as green economy, as well as to international regulatory frameworks and initiatives that the concerted

How should leaders lead? There is probably no domain of public life in which leadership does not play a decisive role in modelling cooperation, participatory action, innovation and co-creation. It is against the background of this conceptual thought that participants will be invited to study the proposed material on leadership agency, on accountability and shared creation. A central part of the course is dedicated to the understanding of leadership in alignment with the living of values in democratic societies and in the management of differences, complemented by cross-cultural aspects of leadership and the study of literature and arts.

This course aims to develop critical thinking about the theory and practice of responsible leadership. It will examine different theories, and will focus on dialogical leadership which enables transparent and effective deliberation.

# Ethics in Higher Education for Teaching Professionals

The course is intended for faculty members, academic teachers and researchers in Higher Education Institutions (HEI) and will help them recognise, understand and address ethical issues in personal, institutional and professional contexts. Course participants will be asked to reflect on existing policies and practices within their institutions, and more broadly, within the higher education sector. Knowledge and tools will be provided to reflect on ethical dilemmas in the context of teaching, conducting research, accompanying students and engaging with higher education policies through the lens of an ethicist. Course participants will be guided to analyse relevant case studies in view of developing ethical frameworks such as codes of ethics, regulations and other standardising instruments appropriate for their teaching praxis.

# Interreligious Cooperation for Peace (Part C: Ethical Studies)

This course is part of the Interreligious Cooperation for Peace course. A total of 24 units, structured on three parts with 8 units each: religious studies (Part A), cultural studies (part B), and ethical studies (part C), designed for an incremental learning path with many cross-references from one course part to the other. However, each course part can be taken separately.

The learning contents of this course emphasise the role of ethical principles, standards, and values in building trustful relationships among people of different religions.

The course participants will develop critical discernment capacities related to conditions, situations, attitudes, and behaviours, leading to conflict and those conducive to building just and peaceful communities. Furthermore, a broad range of conceptual and practice-oriented assignments will help course participants to apply the
