

## Club 100: short description

Cloning in Korea, Business Ethics in China, Environmental Ethics in the Amazon, ethical responses to fundamentalism in all world regions: Globethics.net wants to make a contribution to ethical orientation in a globalised world. The global network on ethics, Globethics.net, meanwhile consists of 110 institutions and approximately 3900 individuals from all continents. Our mission is to:

- Provide access to knowledge resources on ethics through our Global Digital Library on Ethics
- Facilitate **networking** on ethics in our Globethics.net online community of persons and organizations
- Stimulate global collaborative **research** on selected fields such as business ethics, interreligious ethics and responsible leadership

Our aim is to strengthen ethical action and responsible leadership particularly by encouraging north-south and south-south co-operation involving specialists and leaders from developing countries and emerging markets.

In order to sustainably develop our projects and achieve our goals we need financial support. In 2007 we therefore decided to launch the «*Globethics.net - Club 100*» as a complement to the donations we receive from the Swiss Government and various foundations. It is aimed at individuals who would like to make a financial contribution to Globethics.net in a sustainable way. The members of the Club 100 commit themselves to support Globethics.net during three years with a substantial annual amount. Our aim is to extend the list of members to 100 people.

Furthermore, being a member of the Club 100 doesn't just mean financial support but also offers certain advantages which are described on the second page.

Globethics.net is a non-profit Foundation exempted from taxes and under federal surveillance.

## Offers to members of the Globethics.net Club 100

- At least once a year we invite you to a **private event** for Club 100 members. A presentation or discussion will be organised around a specific theme or event. You will meet renowned experts in applied ethics and/or an invited guest from a developing country or from an emerging market who will present and share their knowledge and experiences and invite you to participate in a discussion. At the same time you will be updated on the latest developments of Globethics.net and will have the opportunity to exchange opinions with participants of the network or other members of the Club 100.  
Example: A business ethicist from Indonesia talks about the status of business ethics in his country and the effects of foreign investments.
- We can advise and assist you in setting up contacts or partnerships with ethicists in all regions of the world.
- You will regularly receive the Globethics.net **newsletter** with all the latest information on the library, the network and the secretariat.
- You will have the same **direct access to the network and the library** as the Globethics.net participants.
- You will receive the **annual report** and the **annual accounts** of Globethics.net.
- The books published in the Globethics.net series (1-2 annually) will be sent to you free of charge (Example Volume 2: "Overcoming Fundamentalism" edited by Christoph Stückelberger and Heidi Hadsell, 2009, Geneva: Globethics.net).
