## Unique Online Chinese Christianity Collection OCCC Released

**The worldwide largest online Collection on Chinese Christianity is now available. Over 34'500 full text documents, multilingual and for free can be downloaded on [www.chinesechristianity.online](http://www.chinesechristianity.online), soon available on [www.chinesechristianity.cn](http://www.chinesechristianity.cn). A unique Chinese initiative with international partners.**

China's culture from ancient to contemporary time includes a very rich variety of influences such as Confucianism, Buddhism, Daoism and Socialism. Also Chinese Christianity since the 8<sup>th</sup> century contributed e.g. in education and social services. The new Online Chinese Christianity Collection OCCC facilitates online access to historic and contemporary academic books, articles and journals. OCCC offers 34,500 full text documents, weekly growing in number. A detailed classification tree and advanced search functionalities allow quick orientation.

*Four sources of content* are included:

1. Among the journals are International Journal of Sino-Western Studies, Journal of Chinese Religions, Nanjing Theological Review, Chinese Theological Review, Duihua - mit China im Dialog, China Heute: Informationen über Religion und Christentum im chinesischen Raum, Religions & Christianity in Today's China, Ching Feng Quarterly Notes on Christianity and Chinese Religion.
2. Documents from Partner Institutions such as the famous Reichelt collection of the Institute of Sino-Christian Studies in Hong Kong or the Yale Divinity Library's Day Missions Collection
3. Books, Journal Articles, Dissertations, Conference Proceedings from Chinese Academic Publishers, subscribed from the largest Chinese online provider CNKI (China National Knowledge Infrastructure)
4. Open Sources harvested from over 100 OAI Repositories

Two thirds of the documents are in Chinese, the others in English, German, French and others.
