Hindu Ethics Online Collection launched at the Global Ethics Forum in Bangalore

Bangalore/Geneva. Increasing the access to scientific texts on religious ethics contributes to understanding and peace between religions. A new innovative online collection on Hindu Ethics was launched at the Global Ethics Forum in Bangalore on 3 January. It includes a detailed and innovative classification and already over 1300 articles and books.

The online collection offers access for free and without login to over 1300 full text articles and books. The very detailed classification structure with over 300 categories is the result of scientific work with specialists on the Ethical Philosophy of Hinduism. It includes classical foundational, Holy texts, the different orthodox systems, texts of Hindu institutions, associations and schools. It can also be sorted by themes of applied ethics such as Hindu economic ethics, environmental ethics, political ethics or bioethics.

Globethics.net is a global online network of almost 100'000 individuals, and of institutions from all sectors of society, with participants from more than 200 countries. It has a special focus on business ethics, responsible leadership and interreligious ethics. It offers a global digital library on ethics with 1.4 million documents for free access.
